## **Deepening Our Discipleship**

What does Christmas mean to you? When the streets are lined with decorations on the light poles, I am reminded of my childhood hometown. When we decorate our home for Christmas, I remember our family's story through ornaments given to us by friends and family or purchased when we were married, when our children were born, or on vacation. When I gather with friends and family, I remember how blessed I am to be shaped and supported by these people in my life. When I hear the hope of the prophets and the song of the angels, I remember that the greatest gift is wrapped by my memories, but it is not my memories. The greatest gift, when I open my memories like beautiful wrapping paper folded and set aside to keep, is the gift of love. The message of the baby born in a stable in Bethlehem is that every person is loved. "For God so loved the world, that he sent his only begotten Son... (John 3:16)." God loves you. This is the message of Christmas, under the wrapping, the music, and the decorations. How will you share the message?



Every two years, the youth group studies the particulars of the Presbyterian faith. For many, it is a time honored process of Confirmation. At the end, Confirmands answer four questions in front of the congregation.

- Trusting in the gracious mercy of God, do you turn from the way of sin and renounce evil and its power in the world?
- Who is your Lord and Savior?
- Will you be Christ's faithful disciple, obeying his Word and showing his love?
- Will you devote yourself to the church's teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers?

Beginning January 6 we will be preparing for these questions to be answered March 3rd in worship. Throughout this program there will be opportunities to visit other worshiping communities and practices. Feel free to join us on these field trips and explore your own understanding of faith with us.



And I also thank you. Without fanfare you share your time, toil, talent, and treasure with our partners.

Please keep us in your prayers. We will do the same.
