Ms. Linda and I want to thank all of our staff, families and children for such a great school year so far! We are winding down our third month and have been very busy! As I mentioned last month we ended September with a big reading event, "Buggy for Books" and a Scholastic Book Fair. The goal for the preschool classes was to read 2,500 books in 2 weeks, the classrooms not only reached that goal, but read almost 3,000 books!!! Since all preschool classes reached and exceeded their goals they were treated to a classroom pizza party! Our book fair goal was to sell \$2,500 worth of books and we sold \$2,627 worth of books, which gave us almost \$1,400 to spend on items for the classrooms!

We took all 4 year old classrooms on a field trip to Priddy Farms Pumpkin Patch in October and the children had a great time. They got to ride the day school "bus" and go on their first field trip. Once we got there they could run around and play on their play equipment, ride a hayrack to the pumpkin patch and pick out their own special pumpkin, ride a train around the farm, walk through the Spooky Woods and we finished the trip by having an outdoor lunch at the farm!

The month of Thanksgiving gives us plenty to be

thankful for. We are planning classroom Thanksgiving Feast lunches for the children and a fellowship dinner for our staff. Ms. Melissa's 4 year old class is practicing a Thanksgiving Play and will be performing for the parents. The goal is to share the love of God through hospitality. Shelter is a basic necessity that more than 2,000 people in Memphis are living without each night. Faith communities have warm buildings and people who can provide this necessity along with much needed meals and a good helping hand of kindness and respect.

Room in the Inn-Memphis continues to recruit more local congregations to become partners in this transforming ministry. Farmington will be hosting every other week beginning November 5 - March 17. Rev. Have you heard the story about two men stranded on a desert island? One seemed cheerful and upbeat; the other was nervous and dispirited. The second man spoke first, 'Why are you so happy? Don't you know we'll never be found? We'll both surely die on this forsaken island.' 'Cheer up,' replied the first man. 'We'll be just fine. My church pledge is due next week, and I know the finance committee will find me!'"

hances are if you have kids in sports or competitions of any kind, you have a growing collection of ribbons and medals, sashes and badges, certificates, trophies, or plaques. Some might hang on your walls or sit propped up on shelves somewhere. But if we're honest, others get stuffed into a drawer and eventually thrown out. These were so important when they first came into our homes, but at some point they just lost their value. All those awards and medals can only mean so much, because honor has a deeper meaning.

People should not just be honored because of what they do; they should primarily be honored because of who they are. Stuff will lose value over time, but not people. At its core, honor is seeing people the way God sees people. We're naturally wired to put ourselves first, but honor is the opposite of self-centeredness. It is something that flows from your relationship with God. In a sense, one of the best ways we can HONOR God, is by honoring those who reflect the image of God.

Throughout Scripture we see how much God loves us:

He created us in His image. He knows the number of hairs on our heads. We are fearfully and wonderfully made. He pursued a relationship with us even when we wanted nothing to do with Him. He sent His only Son to pay for our sins to make an eternal relationship with Him possible. And He did all of this for us without us even asking.

Jesus was the ultimate example of someone who showed others their value.

When Jesus came here, He showed us how to love and show honor to those around us. He taught us to love our enemies, care for the "least of these," and become the servants of all who puts others' needs before our own.

That's why it's important for us to help our kids and families discovery more about honor letting someone know you see how valuable they really are.

Our Memory Verse for November comes from Romans 12. Throughout the chapter, Paul casts a vision for the church and how they can live as people transformed by God's Holy Spirit.

In Romans 12:10, we read, "Love one another deeply. Honor others more than yourselves." (NIrV) As kids memorize this verse, we hope they understand that honor includes seeing others how God sees them. When kids start doing that, they will be more willing to show God's love to others and put their needs ahead of their own.

One place you can go as a leader or parent to help kids understand the concept of honor is the life of David. There are some powerful lessons about honor that show up all throughout David's story.



Pick up your shoe box from Farmington and return it by November 20nd.


