As I thought about love and the journey toward the cross, though, I realized that on Ash Wednesday we commit ourselves to an intentional time of preparation to celebrate the most incredible gift of love any of us could ever receive and that preparation forms us to be more like the one who gives that gift of love, Jesus, our Savior. So, perhaps, it is fitting that we celebrate Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday together. We will have a special Italian meal of Spaghetti and Meatballs together at 5:45 pm with worship with Imposition of Ashes at 7 pm.

Did you know? Legend says that St. Valentine's was beheaded on February 14, 269 A.D. by Emperor Claudius for conducting marriage ceremonies. Claudius believed that young soldiers fought better if they weren't bothered with worries about a wife and family, so he issued an edict forbidding the marriage of young people.

February 14 we will have an Ash Wednesday Service in the Sanctuary at 7pm with the imposition of ashes.



A Congregational Meeting was called for the purposes of receiving the 2017 Annual Report and electing the 2018 Elder Nominating Committee.
