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Deepening Our Discipleship

The 4th Century philosopher and scientist, Aristotle stated, "Where your talents and the needs of the world cross; there lies your vocation." In worship during the month of June, we will be exploring what it means to answer God's call. I frequently hear from people, "but I don't have a talent." That doesn't mean that God can't or won't call you. Consider the Apostle Paul's words to the church at Corinth,

"Look at your situation when you were called, brothers and sisters! By ordinary human standards not many were wise, not many were powerful, not many were from the upper class. But God chose what the world considers foolish to shame the wise. God chose what the world considers weak to shame the strong. And God chose what the world considers low-class and low-life—what is considered to be nothing—to reduce what is considered to be something to nothing. So no human being can brag in God's presence (I Corinthians 1:26-29, Common English Bible)."

So, how do we know what our call is?

Through the process of discernment. Discernment is seeking God's will in making decisions about our lives. If you wonder what your call in life may be, I encourage you over the coming weeks, to place an empty notebook and pen beside your bed. Each night, draw a line down one page in the notebook. On one side, list all of the...

...things in your day that gave you joy, that energized you, and that gave you a sense of satisfaction. On the other side of of the page, list all the things in your day that made you anxious or caused you to worry, that drained you, and that gave you a sense of burden. Don't judge the list. Just honestly put it on paper. After several weeks, take some time to notice the trends.

God, by the work of the Holy Spirit, is present and active in our daily lives, drawing us toward the God's will for us which is found where our greatest joy and deepest satisfaction lie.



The Letters to the Galatians and Ephesians

Paul wrote the letter to the Galatians to refute a belief that restricted God's grace to those who followed Jewish ritualistic law. In the letter to the Ephesians, Paul was more meditative and poetic in his style as he wrestled with problems of good and evil to present that unity will be achieved ultimately when all things are gathered together in Christ. Beginning June 17, Rev. Neil Sherman and Sara Millar will be leading a class in the East Room from 9:30-10:45 am on these two letters utilizing William Barclay's Commentary in the New Day Study Bible.

May we each seek to discern and live our true vocation!



How the Rapture Involves Israel

Each Sunday morning in June, Rev. Luter will be leading a study written by Dr. W. Eugene March. W. Eugene March is A. B. Rhodes Professor of Old Testament Emeritus at Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary. He is the author or coauthor of a number of books, including *Israel and the Politics of Land* and *God's Land on Loan*.

This class meets in the Fellowship Hall from 9:45-10:45.

The first session (June 3) discusses the end of time, what the Bible says about it, and what different Christians believe. Session 2 (June 10) takes on the rapture and dispensationalism and how the birth of the modern country of Israel ignited many Christian evangelicals to focus their attention on the rapture and Israel. Finally, Session 3 (June 17) focuses on the current international political implications of this belief on the modern state of Israel and all who live in Palestine. This study was written in 2006, so the fourth week (June 24) we will be discussing the current state of affairs and the 223rd General Assembly's actions pertaining to the Middle East.
