Deepening Our Discipleship

The Council of Nicaea, which took place in 325 AD, set aside the beginning of Lent and autumn as times of reconciliation. Therefore, we know that observing 40 days of penitence and preparation for Easter was established and commonly practiced by all Christians by the 4th Century.

How will you prepare for Easter? We have several opportunities that are open to members, visitors, Day School families, and community members! The 3 Lenten Disciplines are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

- 1. You are invited to pray the Scriptures by reading them in a way that listens more for God's message to you than the content of the pages. You will find more about Lectio Divina ("Divine Reading") on page 5 of this newsletter. We have created a calendar of short passages from Luke's Gospel for all to pray the life of Jesus throughout Lent. We will also be practicing this way of praying the Scripture each Wednesday evening after our dinner together.
- 2. You are invited to fast your time, to give up some of your time for Bible Study with a small group. The Lenten discipline of fasting is meant to challenge us to give up something that is precious to us. In our world today, little is more precious to us than our time. Gather a group of friends on your own, or sign up on the registration forms available at the Welcome Desk or...

...the Church Office. This year we will be using Rev. Adam Hamilton's **Simon Peter: Flawed But Faithful Disciple**. Each week, you will have a chapter of Rev. Hamilton's book to read and then gather with your group to watch a DVD presentation by Rev. Hamilton on location in the Holy Land about the world in which Simon Peter lived and to discuss what you can learn from Simon Peter's life. More information is available on p. 8 of this newsletter.

3. You are invited to practice almsgiving. Almsgiving is giving to charity, beyond your tithe to the church. This Sunday, March 3rd, we begin our campaign to package more than 20,000 meals for distribution to provide a safety net to children at school and the sick in hospitals in developing countries and emergency relief for those who have been devastated by natural disasters. You can learn more about the work of Rise Against Hunger at www.riseagainsthunger.org. Each meal costs 34 cents. Most of us have the opportunity to eat 3 meals a day. Will you consider giving \$1 per day throughout Lent so that others have the opportunity to eat? Our packaging event will be May 5th, and we hope you will sign up to be a part of it, as well. Brochures will be available at the Welcome Desk and the Church Office.

It is sometimes said that every Sunday is a little Easter. It is true that every Sunday we celebrate the life of Jesus and the life we have been called to live in his likeness. This year, throughout Lent, each Sunday we will be listening again to the stories of Jesus' life as told by the Gospel of Luke. We invite you to join us at 11 am each Sunday for worship.

Praying the Scripture or "Lectio Divina"

You are invited to pray the words of Luke's Gospel throughout Lent. You will find verses for each day on the calendar in the newsletter. As you prepare for this Lenten discipline, consider what time is best for you to be quiet: perhaps it is the first thing in the morning, during lunch, in the evening, or during a break at work. Then, think about where you will be at that time. Is there a chair or a table where you like to sit? How can you make that place more "set apart": perhaps you will place a candle there, or a cross, or a plant. Place your calendar and these instructions in your Bible in that spot and schedule an alarm on your phone for that time. When you come to pray, follow these steps:

Prepare Take a moment to breathe. Close your eyes, and let your body relax. Think these words (or similar) to God, "Be present here, O God. I am open to you speaking to me in these moments."

Read Turn to the passage and read it slowly, pausing between phrases and sentences, listening for a word or phrase that stands out to you or catches your attention. Allow a moment of silence, repeating that word or phrase softly to yourself, pondering it and savoring it as though it were the words of a love letter written to you. This is the word that is meant for you. Be content to listen simply and openly, without judging or analyzing.

Reflect Read the passage again, this time listening for the way this passage connects with your life. Ask, "What is it in my life right now that needs to hear this word?" Allow several moments of silence following this reading, and explore your thoughts and perceptions. Consider what it would be like to be present in the story, with Jesus. Where are you in the scene? Is Jesus speaking to you? Imagine the sand, the sun, the smells, the sounds, then ask, "What do I hear as I imagine myself in the story or hear these words addressed specifically to me?"

Respond Read the passage a third time, listening for your deepest, most honest response to what you have read. After reading, allow your prayer to flow spontaneously from your heart in a personal dialogue with God, sharing with God the feelings and thoughts this passage has aroused. You may want to write you thoughts or speak them aloud, whatever is best for you to be completely honest about where you are, what challenges you, what scares you, what feelings of joy, love, sorrow, anger, desire, need, repentance, or other feelings you have in response to the word you have heard.

Rest Read a final time and breathe deeply. You have given a full response to God, so now you can release and rest in God's presence. God loves you and accepts you as you are; God never gives up on you and meets you where you are, inviting you to let his image grow in you.

Resolve Throughout the day, carry the word or phrase that spoke to you with you. Let your thoughts ponder it. You may want to choose an image or a symbol to remind you of it. You may want to write it on your calendar (digital or paper) or on a post-it note that you place somewhere you will see throughout the day. You will find that as you mull this word or phrase over, you will be led deeper and deeper into its meaning for you, until it begins to live in you.

A word of encouragement: When we are first learning a new dance, we are very awkward and very concerned about getting it right. We watch our feet, trying to get them to do what they are supposed to do. We wonder what to do with our hands. If we are dancing with a partner, we may be clumsy at first as we try to figure out how to move together gracefully. But in the end, the point is to be able to enter the dance, flow with it, improvise and enjoy the person we are dancing with.




