Deepening Our Discipleship

I have been thinking a lot lately about how I will observe Valentine's Day throughout February. I have seen parents who put hearts on their children's doors each night of February leading up to the 14th noting something about the child that they love. I have thought of sending cards to the children of the church to let them know that the Farmington family loves them (see "A Letter in the Box" to take part). I have thought about family and friends I haven't seen this year and considered ways to let them know that I love and miss them. Chris and I generally see Valentine's Day as a "card/candy makers' holiday" and do not observe it with gifts. Estimates are that in 2021, over 25 BILLION dollars will be spent in the United States to celebrate Valentine's Day.

With Valentine's Day generally close to Ash Wednesday, I usually use this space to focus on the later. The history of Valentine's Day didn't begin with merchants, though. In the 200's, Bishop Valentine was repeatedly arrested for trying to convert people to Christianity and to assist Christians who were being persecuted. He also was imprisoned for marrying couples who were Christian, thus the connection to love. Bishop Valentine was martyred for refusing to renounce his faith. Emperor Claudius ordered him beaten with clubs, beheaded, and his bodied burned in the street on February 14th – not exactly what we normally think about when we wish one another "Happy Valentine's Day!"

Perhaps the story of St. Valentine might be an encouragement to us to consider our own level of commitment to Christianity and engage in a Lenten class or practice this year. Perhaps when we hear "Happy Valentine's Day!" we could consider what our greatest loves are. May we love the Lord our God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength!

YOUTH FELLOWSHIP STUMP THE PASTOR





Session Report

Session received the Annual Pastor Feedback Analysis. Further discussion and action will be taken around these areas identified in the report: "Multiple session members report they would like to see increased involvement in church life and activities from all age groups both by church members and day school families. development is an area of opportunity as well and was noted in the majority of the comments. There is also a similar desire to more deeply engage new members. Mentioned frequently by Session members is the opportunity dive into Vision Casting and Long-Term Planning during this time period. There is a theme among comments that we are lacking in alignment of the entire congregation and a desire to convene the Ruling Elders and Committees on roles, responsibilities and planning. Community building, service, planning and coordinating are areas that seem to warrant further discussion among Rev. Luter and the Session." Rev. Luter's Terms of Call will remain the same for 2021. Session approved making the unused 12 days of vacation and 10 days of study leave from 2020 available for use by Rev. Luter through 2023.

Session accepted the Memorials and Gifts Subcommittee's 2020 Annual Report. Session decided that Sunday worship will remain online via YouTube through February with Wednesday night services on Zoom. Communion will be served at the first Wednesday night Zoom service. There will be a brief

outdoor Ash Wednesday Service with safe imposition of ashes. Worship Committee is discussing how and when we will return to worship in the Sanctuary.

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

has called a Congregational Meeting for Sunday, February 21st following 11:00 Worship. The meeting will take place on Zoom. The purposes of the meeting are to receive the 2020 Annual Report, which will be mailed to all member households prior to the meeting and to elect the 2021 Nominating Committee. Session elected Suzanne Thomas to chair the Nominating Committee and MaryShelley Ritchey to serve as the second elder on the committee. Please consider who you would like to nominate and whether you would like to serve on the Nominating Committee and be prepared with nominations at the Congregational Meeting.

Session held a Called Meeting on Wednesday, January 20th, to consider whether to apply for a second Payroll Protection Plan loan. The decision was made to apply, and the application has been submitted.

"The Book of Ecclesiastes: Living Your Best Life in a Time of Crisis"

The book of Ecclesiastes is one of the strangest and most ignored books in the biblical canon, yet its wisdom seems perfectly crafted for such a time as this-because the author, a sage known only as Qohelet, had first-hand knowledge about living in themidst of a crisis. In this workshop, we will discuss the historical context for the book of Ecclesiastes and explore its life-affirming, experiential and even joyful message.

Brennan Breed is Associate Professor of Old Testament at Columbia Theological Seminary and Theologian-in-Residence at First Presbyterian Church in Marietta, Ga. He is author of the monograph Nomadic Text (Indiana University Press, 2014) and coauthor of Daniel: A Commentary (Westminster John Knox, 2014) with Carol Newsom. Brennan is currently writing on Ecclesiastes and the early Hellenistic era in the Levant. He lives in Decatur, Georgia with his wife, Catherine, his children, Freddie and Margaret Ann, and his miniature schnauzer, Winnie.

Lent, the 40 days leading up to the celebration of Easter, was in the early church a time of preparation for baptism. For those who are baptized, it is a time to deepen our faith practices and restore glorifying God as our first priority in life. Each year, the Farmington family engages in small group study during this time to reflect and grow. This year we will be forming groups that are virtual. Groups may decide to meet together, following CDC guidelines for safety, when all in the group have received full COVID vaccination. The format includes a video and Scripture-based discussion. Groups will meet for approximately 2 hours each week to discuss these topics: Who Is God? Who Are We? God in Relationship. God Who Saves. God of Action. God of Belonging.
