Deepening Our Discipleship

Pentecost Sunday is May 23rd!

What is Pentecost?

Pentecost is the day we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. Luke tells us in Acts that those who were of one accord were all together in Jerusalem. Suddenly, a sound rushed like a mighty wind, filling the house where they were sitting. And what appeared to be tongues of fire rested on each of them, filling them with the Holy Spirit.

When is Pentecost?

Some will say that Pentecost is celebrated 50 days after Easter, and while that is true, it misses the symbolic placement of Pentecost. Pentecost Sunday is celebrated on the 7th Sunday after Easter Sunday. Seven was the number in ancient times of perfection and completion.

What do we wear on Pentecost?

Traditionally, the color that symbolizes the Holy Spirit is red, so we wear red to church on Pentecost Sunday.

Why do we have parties on Pentecost?

Pentecost is celebrated as the birthday of the church because before the gift of the Holy Spirit, the believers were together and praying, but they were not sharing the good news! On Pentecost, they were filled with the ability to speak in every language and the Gospel spread. 3,000 were baptized that day! And day after day, the Lord added to their number. Farmington Presbyterian was officially organized on Pentecost Sunday in 1975. So, on Pentecost we celebrate both the birthday of the church universal, and of Farmington!

Session Report

Session adopted a revised 2021 Budget in response to faithful giving in the first guarter of 2021 and relaxing restrictions on gathering. We are planning VBS July 26-30. Salary ranges for Director and Assistant Director of Farmington Presbyterian Day School were adopted. Rev. Rebecca Luter will be on vacation May 26-June 3 and June 29-July 16. Doug Barr will preach on May 30, and Kirsten King will preach on July 11. A proposal for upgrading audio system and installing video capability in the Sanctuary to support hybrid and online worship ministry was approved. A request from the Farmington's Presbyterian Women to gather for lunch on the grounds on May 16th after worship was approved. Paul King and Jinney Hart reported on the Called Meeting of the Presbytery of the Mid-South on March 23rd. The purpose of the meeting was to act on a Covenant Agreement between the Presbytery and Pinecrest Camp and Retreat Center (both related motions passed). Updates were shared related to Rev. Luter's 2021 Work Plan goals and Session brainstormed strategies to achieve the goals.

You are invited to participate in achieving these goals, too. Rev. Luter's Work Plan Goals:

1. Strategize for future and recruiting leadership for FPDS. 2. Implement a strategy for engagement of non-member, virtual worship participants. 3. Plan and execute a post-pandemic ministry plan which includes both in-person and virtual worshipers. Have ideas? Send Rev. Luter an email!



- 1 bar of soap (bath size in wrapper)
- 1 toothbrush (in original packaging)
- 10 Band-Aids® or other adhesive bandage strips

The Women's Circle of Farmington Presbyterian Church has concluded its study of Into the Light Finding Hope Through Prayers of Lament. Kirsten King diligently and faithfully guided us through the process of exploring lamenting by helping us define a lament; discussing why we lament; and in writing our own personal laments as we learned to use this tool as a personal way to communicate with God and open the lines of communication. The process of lamenting is an act of great faith as we address God, describe our grievance, state our trust in God, and show our assurance as we call God to act. We found this study to be most appropriate as we dealt with the Global Pandemic! We concluded our study with the comfort of knowing that at the end of lament there is an affirmation of trust and hope in God. The author, P. Lynn Miller states, "God isn't somewhere out there waiting in a perfect place. God is walking beside each of us in our troubles today, hearing our cries and answering our calls".



Although we were not able to assemble in person, our Women's Circle continued to fulfill its mission of giving. We contributed to Johnson Auxiliary, Mission Haven, Pinecrest Camp, Soup Kitchen, and Church Health Center. Contributions for the Birthday Offering and the Thank Offering were gratefully acknowledged! Blessings to all as we take this journey with our Savior every day!



As I have said many times, when Bonnie Blair asks you to do anything, you don't say no. It's probably going to stretch you and take you out of your comfort zone and ultimately make you grow. So, when Bonnie asked me to deliver the message of Poverty on Gifts of Women Sunday, I immediately said yes.

I immediately began thinking about the topic and discussing it with the closest person that would listen (thanks Scott). It is a massive subject and a daunting one to express in 15 minutes on Sunday mornina. Naturally. made connection with my family law practice. I encounter the effect of systemic poverty quite often in family law. The effects of poverty are enhanced when the family is struggling with other issues too and vice versa. Then there was, of course, the Bible. How had God expressed Himself about poverty? What did Jesus have to say on the subject? The parable of the goats and the sheep was our scripture that morning. Jesus could not have been clearer in His call to action.

I was sitting in Youth Court in North Mississippi with the subject weighing on my heart when a mother, through fear and helplessness and with the help of a friend/translator, communicated with the judge about her six children. The social worker assigned to the case began to list for the court the ways that the agency was trying to help the family and avoid taking the children into custody. This is always the agency's first

consideration and is termed "reasonable efforts to prevent removal." I heard about the need for clothing for the children, the need for beds and bedding, and ultimately a need for rental assistance. I immediately thought, "the Farmington Family can you help this family, and possibly change the course of events for them." I recognized it as a rare opportunity in my experience. I told the social worker that I would have an audience of generous folks who would undoubtedly respond if called upon to help this particular family and with her assistance I indeed put out the call on Gifts of Women Sunday.

To say that the response was overwhelming is an understatement. With the assistance of Jinney Hart, Service Committee Chair, there was a truckload of donations of clothing, bedding, and other necessities. I dropped them off on Thursday, April 22 at our regular court date, and watched as two CPS employees drove away and directly to the home of this family in need. There are cash donations as well. I have discussed with CPS the method of delivering these funds directly to the rental office and/or the electric company. I intend to do that on May 13.

Thank you again for your generosity. Farmington has certainly shown God's love to this family and you are without a doubt the sheep that Jesus described in Matthew 25:31-46, and by your love, everyone will know you are disciples of Jesus (John 13:35).

Meritan is vaccinating homebound Memphians. Meritan is providing this vital service for Shelby, Fayette, Tipton, and Lauderdale county residents who are homebound and would have difficulty traveling to a vaccination site due to medical or mobility issues. There is no charge for the service; however, they will collect insurance information (if applicable) to bill for the administration fee, which helps to cover the cost of providing the mobile vaccine. They can also vaccinate caregivers or family members in the home during the visit.
