Deepening Our Discipleship

In the grey cold days of winter, as we approach the 24th month of pandemic, you may find that you are tired and weary and beginning to ask with the Psalmist, "How long, O Lord? Will you forget me forever?" It is as I was praying these words of Psalm 13 that I was reminded of a children's book that I read to my children when they were preschoolers, "Mama, Do You Love Me?" by Barbara M. Joosse. The book features an Inuit mother and child. The Inuit have lived in the northern part of Alaska for more than 9,000 years, and the child asks questions that people have asked of God even longer.

"Do you love me?"

And the answer comes, "Yes I do, Dear One."

"How much?"

"I love you more than the raven loves his treasure, more than the dog loves his tail, more than the whale loves his spout."


"How long?"

"I'll love you until the umiak (a type of large kayak) flies into the darkness, till the starts turn to fish in the sky, and the puffin howls at the moon."

The child asks "What if" - what if she accidently broke something precious, or intentionally did something wrong? What if she ran away? And the parent responds, I would be sorry, ...angry, ... worried.

"What if I stayed away and sang with the wolves and slept in a cave?"

"Then, Dear One, I would be very sad. But still, I would love you....I will love you, forever and always, because you are my Dear One."





PARABLES OF JESUS

Jesus taught in parables, short stories that teach a moral lesson through analogy. We are able to better understand the analogy when we understand the culture of the Middle East in Jesus' time. 


