
#### Deepening Our Discipleship

I realized this week that it is almost time to put up Christmas decorations which, as much as I love curling up on the couch under a blanket with a warm mug in my hands as Christmas tree lights twinkle in an otherwise dark and quiet house, means that it is time for me to get out the carpet cleaner and furniture oil and deep clean that house. Thinking about it, the theme song from "Facts of Life" came to mind. You remember? "You take the good, you take the bad, you take them both and there you have, the facts of life..." Life always seems to be a mixture of some things we are excited about and some things we dread, some good and some bad, some joy and some sadness.

In thinking about Christmas this year, I am aware that the last few years have been difficult for many of us. Here in the school office we are so very thankful for a staff that teaches our children through kindness and patience. We are thankful for our families that share their precious children with us. Last, but certainly not least, we are thankful for the children we get to serve.

We will have a Friendsgiving lunch with our preschool friends and staff and tell them how thankful we are that they are here at school with us. We want to wish each and every one of you a very thankful and blessed month of Thanksgiving.

The Presbyterian Promise Scholarship is a commitment by Presbyterian College (PC) to recognize students for their and affiliation with the merit Presbyterian Church. PC seeks to develop students academically and spiritually in this signature scholarship. Students who are of members of Presbyterian churches will receive a scholarship for a minimum of \$20,000 per year for up to four years—that's an \$80,000 commitment to you. #### TRUE OF HEART: PARTNERING IN THE GENEROSITY OF GOD



What does it mean to be a partner with God? First, to recognize that every thing we have, even our next breath, is a gift from God. Second, to realize that God has been generous to us.

Third, to respond – for our hearts to overflow with gratitude.

The number you put on your pledge card is an estimate of your giving to God in 2023. It is not a contract with the church or a way to collect dues. It is an opportunity for you to express your gratitude for all God has given you and to partner in the generosity of God.

Farmington Presbyterian is a generous church. In 2022, members of the Farmington family gave:

- \$3,227, 100's of sandwiches, bags of clothes, and volunteer support to First Presbyterian Church's Soup Kitchen.
- \$8,800 and volunteer efforts to package 20,000 meals to Rise Against Hunger.
- \$961, ongoing preparation of a weekly meal for 50 guests (began in October), and donations of school supplies, clothes for 2 teenage girls, and household goods for a family moving into housing supported the work of Room in the Inn.
- \$9,510 to send a team from Farmington to partner in the construction of 3 cisterns in the region near Xpujil, Mexico, providing safe drinking water for the recipient families.
- \$6,611 to One Great Hour of Sharing to support relief in Ukraine.
- \$500 to the Peacemaking Offering
- \$810 to the Pentecost Collection for ministries supporting atrisk children
- \$19,654 to the mission work of the PC(USA) Presbytery of the Mid-South, Synod of Living Waters, and Presbyterian Mission Agency
- Our work to alleviate hunger and its causes was recognized by the PC(USA) and our designation as a Hunger Action Congregation was renewed.

Stewardship Sunday is November 13th. You will have the opportunity to bring forward your estimate of giving in 2023. May we be true of heart as we make our commitments to partner with God in ministry through Christ's church.

#### SESSION REPORT

Session received presentation, given by Jennifer Young on behalf of Administration Committee, of the findings from Rev. Luter's annual performance evaluation and discussed the proposed work plan for the coming year. September finance report was accepted and updates received on the Day Property School, Grounds projects, and Service events and mission work. Ann Erickson Jinney Hart were elected to be Ruling Elder Commissioners to November 10 th meeting of the Presbytery of the Mid-South. Bob Plotner was designated as alternate commissioner. The elder training of Doug Barr, Ann Erickson, and Jinney Hart was upheld, and they will be installed as Ruling Elders, Class of 2025, during worship on Sunday, October 23rd.

Session discussed engaging a consultant to revisit our vision and mission and to help us establish corresponding plans and goals for the Farmington family for the next 5-10 years.


