Deepening Our Discipleship

Beginning May 26th, I will be taking a Sabbatical. What is that? It is a time of intentionally setting aside the mantel of pastor to tend my relationship with God and my relationships with my family. I was ordained in June of 2000 and have not ever taken a time away. I love being a pastor. I love being your pastor. So, why am I taking Sabbatical? I feel God calling me to address a particular question.

During the pandemic, the church began acting outside the bounds of polity because there was no "rule book" for how to be church in a time of isolation. We were assured (and assured one another) that there would "be a lot of grace" if we just did what seemed right at the time. One of the ministries that was born in this time was hybrid worship. It is challenging that we have no best practices or guidelines for hybrid worship or for how to engage, nurture, and lead an online disciple. I will be studying how churches have adapted, what is effective, and developing educational tools for pastors out of that study.

I am also taking time away to think, pray, and study deeply what we believe about Holy Communion. I feel called to be a part of the theological discussion around what we ought to do in hybrid worship related to Communion. Eventually, we will have polity that guides how we conduct Communion online. That polity must grow out of our understanding of theology.

I am excited and energized about this work. The hardest part will be being away from you. I know that I leave you in good hands. Tom Sauer will be faithful and helpful. He is wise and kind and honest. He will serve with energy, intelligence, imagination, and most of all, love. I know, always, you are in God's hands and that there is no better place to be.

I'll be writing this note each month to update you on what I have been studying and learning, and I will see you and catch up in the weeks after I return on September 4th.

Rev. Luter will begin her sabbatical leave on Friday, May 26, 2023. A sabbatical, according to the Office of the General Assembly (OGA), is a "planned time of intensive enhancement for ministry and mission." Different from a vacation, it is meant to be an opportunity for the pastor to strategically disengage from normal tasks so that mission and ministry might be viewed from a new perspective. During this time, Rev. Luter is not to engage in the ministry of Farmington or be in contact with the members of Farmington.

Rev. Luter will return on Tuesday, September 4, 2023. Please support her with your prayers as she embarks on this spiritual retreat for renewal and development of relationships with God and others. Pray that this time will provide her much needed rest for her body, mind, and soul as well as time to focus on her pursuit of advanced studies in the Doctor of Ministry program at Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia.

Tom Sauer, who was commissioned on April 30, 2023 to serve as the temporary pastor during Rev. Luter's sabbatical leave, will preach and lead worship. Tom will also be available to contact if you have prayer requests or experience a family or personal crisis. He will be working approximately 20 hours per week. Bonnie Blair lives her faith as a steadfast foot soldier of God. She works untiringly to make important things happen while bringing out the best in others. She has a way of connecting with people and seeing their talents. She has left huge footprints in her work with Presbyterian Women as well as in many other areas.

Bonnie's life changed when St. Joseph Hospital was bought out by Baptist Hospital in 2000, and she was "downsized" out of a job. Being a "mover and shaker" with very high energy, Bonnie was not content to sit at home. At this time, she was an active member at Whitehaven Presbyterian Church which had a Presbyterian Women's group with three day circles and a night circle. The three day circles met together on the first Tuesday for a monthly gathering with speakers. On a Tuesday after "downsized," Bonnie decided that the circle meeting was where she needed to be. A month later, she was the PW Moderator at Whitehaven Presbyterian Church.

During her service as PW Moderator at Whitehaven Presbyterian Church, Bonnie discovered on the national PW website that any Presbyterian Woman could apply to be on the PW National Board of Directors. At this time, there was a Moderator, known as the Churchwide Moderator.

There was also a Moderator for Missions, and a Moderator for Justice and Peace. Bonnie applied for the Missions Moderator. While waiting to hear from the national group, Bonnie was contacted by Martha Knichel, Synod of Living Waters, PW Moderator, who asked her to be the Synod of Living Waters Representative on the PW National Board of Directors. Bonnie served from 2005 to 2008.

During her time on the PW National Board of Directors, Bonnie was appointed Chair of the Leadership Enhancement Committee. In 2007, she chaired a national leadership training program in Albuquerque, New Mexico that included six PW representatives from each of the sixteen Synods across the United States plus Churchwide Coordinating Team and national staff - 150 women. Because of her work with this conference, Bonnie was invited to speak at PW Presbytery gatherings across the country. The highlight of her speaking engagements was a presentation on "How to Revitalize PW" at the 2009 Churchwide Gatherina where she addressed over 500 women.

Bonnie has also served as Leadership Training Coordinator (2016–2022) for PW Synod of Living Waters, Search Committee Chair (2017–2023) for PW Presbytery of the Mid-South, and Presbytery of the Mid-South Moderator (2011).

While on the Presbytery Coordinating Team, Bonnie introduced the idea of a Clergywomen's retreat to support the clergywomen in our Presbytery. The initial retreat was held at Barbara Denley's home on February 27, 2020.

clergywomen attended participated openly in the discussion based on the theme, "Have Women Broken the Glass Ceiling in the PC(USA)?". A follow-up session was requested. After two years of COVID delays, the long-awaited retreat was held on March 5, 2022, at Pinecrest. Bonnie served as chair of the retreat committee. Thirteen clergywomen and four members of the coordinating team of the PW of the Mid-South attended. As hoped, Rev. Dr. Elizabeth Hinson-Hasty, author of "Have Women Broken the Glass Ceiling in the PC(USA)?", was the speaker.

Among the achievements in her life, Bonnie will tell you the one that means the most to her was having a role in establishing a chapel at the City of Memphis Hospital (now Regional One) as one of the eleven founding members of the Johnson Auxiliary. It took 8 years, from 1973 to 1981, of requesting space to be used for a chapel before the request was finally granted. The tipping point seemed to be when a distraught mother asked for a quiet place to cry and to pray for her badly injured son and there was none. The effort to build a chapel continued until it was finally completed on November 6, 1981. It was relocated to a better space on September 11, 1984.

God has truly blessed us with Bonnie Blair.






