Deepening Our Discipleship

Greetings from Sabbatical! I hope you are taking some time this summer to connect with people you care about, including yourself and God, and to do some things that bring you joy. I have been intentionally dividing my time and attention between spending intentional time with my family, working in the yard and organizing in the house, and studying for my doctorate. My goal is to spend a few hours each day on each of these 3 priorities.

The first week of June I spent at Columbia Theological Seminary meeting with Dr. Martha Moore-Keish about a directed study in Reformed Eucharistic Theology, essentially studying "When we take Communion, what do we believe is happening between us and God?" This directed study will be the basis of the lit. review for my final project in the Doctor of Ministry which will be focused on how we honor the Sacrament of Communion in online worship.

I am excited to share with you that I completed the first draft of my practicum proposal this month and have received positive feedback. I am making some minor edits and resubmitting with the hope to begin the practicum August 1st. The practicum is to be a 6-month study of an area of ministry and my role in it.

I am looking for participants. My practicum is a study of Farmington Presbyterian's worship online. If you worship primarily online and are willing to participate by completing 2 surveys, participating in 2 Zoom conversations, and worshipping with Farmington online at least 6 times this fall, please let me know. I need at least 10 individuals to participate in the practicum. Through this study, I hope to improve the experience of those who worship with us online.

The May Financial Report was accepted. School Board Chair, Mike Schneider, reported that registration for the 2023-24 School Year is strong. An additional budget request was approved for part of the Sanctuary painting project which was not included in the original bid. Session received the report on the May 23rd meeting of the Presbytery of the Midsouth. Service Chair, Jinney Hart, provided a report on the fundraising events for Rise Against Hunger and the Mexico mission trip . An update from Adult Ministries was provided which includes a planned day trip.
