As many of you know from the Wednesday night series Doug and I led several years ago, I love children's books. As I began my Sabbatical this weekend, the first thing I did was read 3 children's books that I had ordered this Spring and not yet had time to read. Grandpa's Window is about a grandchild visiting her grandfather in the hospital and her grief as he died. What in the World Is Wrong with Gisbert is about a giraffe who goes to school and shrinks every time someone comments negatively about him, until his mother encourages him to tell his friends that their words were making him sad. The friends didn't know that their words were hurting him, and they apologize. Then, they turn the very same comments into complements, and Gisbert is restored. The final book was My Elephant Is Blue, about a child who woke up with an elephant to carry everywhere. Mom, Dad, brother, and sister all try to help to no avail. It is only when the child acknowledges and learns to live with the elephant that it no longer is crushing. In fact, it turns pink as they find joy together. The elephant is still there with the child, and there are times it begins to turn blue if the child doesn't give it attention, but now it also has turned other colors. Yellow is their favorite.

If you have children in your life who are going through a difficult time, or a life transition, Doug and I would be happy to help you find a book with discussion questions to help you navigate a healthy conversation.

I promised Sabbatical updates. The main project while I am on Sabbatical is to study peoples' experiences worshiping online.
