I know many of you have wondered about my Sabbatical work, so I'll just go ahead and give you a thumbnail sketch of what I have been doing over the 12 weeks of Sabbatical and 3 weeks of vacation. I have been working on 3 projects related to my pursuit of a Doctor of Ministry. My purpose in continuing my education is to study what we believe about Communion (Reformed Eucharistic Theology) and how that guides our polity which informs our worship practices related to livestreaming and archiving worship services with communion online. This summer, that study has taken the form of a lot of research of online worship services, reading and note-taking! I've read over 2000 pages on the subject over the summer, and while I still have a long way to go before I am finished, I am thankful for the time to dive deep into this subject. This fall you will be hearing more about engagement with those who worship primarily online as I continue my studies.

During Sabbatical, I enjoyed worshipping with a different congregation each Sunday, paying particular attention to their welcoming ministry and to their practices related to communion and online worshippers. In addition, I have gotten my hands in the dirt, spent time with family, travelled, and took Nic to college. It has been a full summer.

I look forward to hearing about your time while I was away and to being back with you. September 10th, we will begin our fall worship series, "Encountering Jesus," with the story of the wedding at Cana. SESSION REPORT

Session received and approved the 2022 Financial Review prepared by HHM, CPAs. The July 2023 Financial Report was accepted. The School Board report included news of strong enrollment for fall, high marks from DHS, and plans for the fall open house in August and two grandparents days in September. Upcoming dates were reviewed including Friendsgiving in November and 10,000 Villages and the PW Bake Sale in December. "What have I done?"

I asked myself this question several times over July 31 – August 5. I asked as we drove away from the beautiful tourist enticing landscape of Cancun, 5 hours into the jungle. I asked again as I was robbed of sleep by the dogs and the roosters making constant noise throughout the night. I asked again as I shoveled my 16th 5 gallon bucket of gravel to be hoisted into the cement mixer. And I asked again as my lower back refused to lift me out of the car as we arrived at the apartment in Xpujil, Mexico from our first of 4 days building cisterns.

This was a hard trip, but a rewarding one. I met amazing people, tasted true Mexican meals, saw more bats than I could imagine, climbed Mayan ruins, and saw God at work in new and heart wrenching ways. We built the bottoms of four cisterns several miles from Xpujil in Cristobal Colon (Christopher Columbus). The first cistern we poured was across the street from a government water project! A large sign in front of it celebrated the administrations work and expense in completing this water provision for the town.



I also want to encourage you to consider taking this trip next summer. It is difficult work, but you will surprise yourself and learn a lot about the people of Mexico living away from the visibility of tourists.




