Laurinda Ingram presented the Commissioners Report from the Stated Presbytery Meeting on November 18 where Lucy Cummings was approved to advance from Inquirer to Candidate in the process toward ordination. Session discussed several upcoming events including the Johnson Auxiliary's rededication of the chapel at Regional One on December 15 (11am), a Battle of the Congregations Trivia Night on January 12 (time TBD) at First Presbyterian, and the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Celebration on January 14 (3pm) at Parkway Gardens.


