FIRST READING Psalm 19

The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge. They have no speech, they use no words; no sound is heard from them. Yet their voice goes out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world. In the heavens God has pitched a tent for the sun. It is like a bridegroom coming out of his chamber, like champion rejoicing to run his course. It rises at one end of the heavens and makes its circuit to the other; nothing is deprived of its warmth. The law of the LORD is perfect, refreshing the soul. This week at Farmington...did you know that you are caring for refugees? We received an update on the current work of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance in Moldova, the poorest country to which Ukrainians fled. Initially 800,000 Ukrainians fled to Moldova. There are just 90,000 still there. Most remain because they are too old or too poor to journey any further. Our contributions to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance fund faith-based organizations like Moldovan Christian Aid who focus on some of the most vulnerable groups and those in more remote communities, away from the larger refugee service centers. Our partners are offering emergency food and provisions, mental health services, youth programs, and livelihood projects like family chicken farms. Amid tragedy and despair, when people "look to the helpers" may we be among those they see.
