Update From MEXICO



JANUARY 31, 2024

Dear Friends,

Thanks to your prayers and generous support, 2024 is off to a strong start. Maria and I are back in Xpujil. God willing, we will be here almost full-time from here on out.

Two Mission Teams

The cistern building season kicked off in the village of Centauro Del Norte. This is our first time working there. The drive from Xpujil to Centauro took only 30 minutes because the roads were free of potholes. (It's an election year.)

On January 8, a group of three from Rapid City, South Dakota began to build four cisterns with our highly experienced cistern building crew (Victor, Raul, Isaias, Diego, and Esau). Together we worked with four laborers from Centauro—one from each of the four cistern–acquiring families. With twelve people working at each site, the concrete pours went quickly and smoothly—despite the occasional presence of a rambunctious goose.

On January 23, eight people from the Memphis, TN area started four more cisterns. The piles of sand and gravel at all four homes were close to the new cistern site. We only had to walk a few steps to fill the cement mixer and pour the walls. The work was completed faster than I have ever seen before thanks to good weather, close-proximity, and thirty-four hands on deck. Everyone had a job to do. Everyone kept busy.

In the future, when someone asks me about mission team member age limits and/or group size, I'll refer to these two groups. Of the ten January travelers, one was a teenager, two were in their 50s, and seven were age 67 and older. Both groups—one small, the other big—lightened the load for our local partners by many, many tons.

For those not familiar with our ministry, I'll point out that both American work teams also accomplished what is potentially more valuable than providing the gift of abundant water. The presence of young/old, men/women from the United States working hard and joyfully with our Mexican partners prompts the local villagers to wonder, "What on earth is happening here?" Victor, Raul, Isaias, Diego, and Esau revere Christ as Lord of their lives, and are glad to clear up any confusion. They respectfully and gently explain how our shared hope in Jesus Christ has brought this uncommon collection of people together to build cisterns. More conversations on faith, water, love for neighbor, etc. often follow. New relationships begin. Some have lasted for decades. This is one way our American work teams help share the Good

News without speaking Spanish, Chol, Yucatan Maya, or Tzeltal.

Session Report

Session approved motions to create the new job position of Livestream Coordinator and update the personnel policy to add this as a contracted staff position. Changes in the wage rate scale were approved to add the Livestream Coordinator position and to increase the wage rate scale for bus drivers. Session approved Rev. James Gale, Executive Presbyter, to preach on Sunday April 28.

The January 2024 Financial Report was accepted. Session discussed church security concerns and next steps to gather input from members. Online viewer statistics were reviewed including a year over year comparison. Session reviewed a list of capital improvement projects which are hoped to be completed this year.
