Gathered to Worship...Sent to Serve In response to God's blessings and to support what God is doing through the Farmington family, you can make your offering through the website, using a checking account, or mail your offering to Farmington Presbyterian Church, 8245 Farmington Boulevard, Germantown, TN 38139.

This week at Farmington... we are thankful to the Germantown Police Department for training 18 of our members last Sunday afternoon on how to respond in an active shooter situation. Here are some key take-aways:

- 1. You have 3 choices in how to respond. You can run, hide, or fight. Always be aware of your surroundings and consider how you might respond if a situation arises.
- 2. Immediately call 911 they are best able to end the threat. When asked for information DO NOT guess! Try to give the location, description of the attacker(s), and number and type of weapons. DO NOT pull the fire alarm; it will confuse responders.
- 3. Shooters expect fear and compliance. Do something the attacker doesn't expect and take them off guard.
